



Workshop: Painting on Fabrics with Inks

September 15-16 • 10:00 am • Holly's Quilt Cabin

TWO day class! Paint offers endless opportunities for creating special effects on fabric, from adding details, dimension or shadow to creating fully illustrated scenes. While working with textile paints, students learn techniques for creating smooth gradations of color, glazing paint to create more visual depth, covering large areas and backgrounds smoothly, avoiding blotchiness, control paint bleeding, how to working with freezer paper masks, and paint smooth lines and fine details.

Artist, explorer, image wrangler, knowledge seeker, creative alchemist, and purveyor of inspiration, Judy Coates Perez helps others channel creativity on a daily basis. She's an International award-winning mixed-media textile artist and author. Judy travels globally to teach painting and mixed-media techniques and lecture about her creative process and sources of inspiration.

"One part gypsy and two parts visual alchemist, I travel to new places, OPENING UP NEW REALMS of possibilities for my students by revealing endless ways to combine paint, paper and metal with fabric and the sources of inspiration we all too often overlook in our immediate worlds."



Category Listing for ACQ Library Books

Last year ACQ raised a total of \$6,500 by selling raffle quilt tickets. More than half of that—\$3,678—came from community events away from ACQ meetings.

The link also includes the Holiday Food & Gift Festival in November. Please sign up early and plan your volunteer time around all the fantastic shopping. The total number of volunteer time slots remaining for 2017 events is 72.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of fundraising. Each year, we have only five community events away from ACQ meetings. The booth space is donated to us at all but one. The one we pay for is Western Welcome Week. In 2016 after our booth fee we made \$225 in only 9 hours! It was wonderful!

The money we raise pays the rent to have a great place to hold our meetings. We also buy some supplies for charity quilts. The most compelling, and entertaining, reason for fundraising is our speakers. The money we have raised has enabled us to have some terrific speakers: Cynthia England, Anelie Belden, Rob Appell, and many more!

Block of the Month (BOM)

Bring one or more of these blocks with you to the October meeting on 10/12/17 for the BOM drawing. Each block you bring gets one ticket in the drawing—you could go home with many blocks! *Find instructions in the August newsletter for the block to bring for the September BOM drawing.*



Candy Corn Block measures 12½" x 11" unfinished.

I freely admit that I don't like Halloween much. I'm the unlit porch in the neighborhood the night kids and parents are all out having fun. BUT I love the candy. So, this month is an ode to a great American candy: Candy Corn. It's not paper pieced, so there is a little more scrap cut as you go, but it was fun to figure out how to do it.

Materials to make 2 blocks:

Yellow fabric: 2 – 11" x 3½" inch rectangles

Orange fabric: 2 – 8½" x 6¼" rectangles

White fabric: 2 – 4¼" x 4¼" squares

Black fabric: 2 – 1½" x 1½" squares

2 – 14" x 6½" rectangles (each rectangle gets cut on a diagonal so 2 are needed to get each side)


Attach one yellow rectangle to one orange rectangle with the midpoints matching. Attach one white square to the opposite side of the orange rectangle also with midpoints matching. I folded the fabric in half, finger pressed the middle, and then pinned at the middle before sewing. Press either way; you are not locking any corners.




Line up a long cutting ruler from the midpoint of the white square to the outer yellow rectangle corner. Cut.



For the other cut, place the fabric right side down (wrong side with seams are face up) with the cut side along the 45° line on the cutting mat with the white fabric corner lined up at a vertical grid lines. Use a ruler along that grid line to cut.




Cut to make a triangle. Trim white point 3 inches from seam. Sew one black 1½" square to the top and trim the edges to complete the triangle.



Take one black 14" x 6½" rectangle and cut from corner to corner on the diagonal. Cut the other black rectangle along the opposite diagonal from corner to corner. You should have 2 rectangular triangles for each side of the “corn”. Attach one triangle to the corn. Press. Attach the other triangle to the corn and press.



Square up the block to 12½" x 11" with the yellow edge as the base.



Time to Talk President's Block **UPDATED MEASUREMENTS 9/3/17**

Pat Syta

Each year ACQ's Past President gathers blocks made by members that are presented to the current President at the end of the year to show our appreciation for their service.

Pat talked with Kelly and she would like a very simple block this year. It's called a **siggy block** and it will finish at 4". Start with a 4½" white square with (2) 3½" squares of any matching color sewn on opposite corners to form triangles. On a 3½" square draw a line diagonally across the square. Place the 3½" square in the corner of the 4½" white square, sew on the line, trim ¼" away from the line, flip and press open. Repeat on the opposite corner with the second 3½" square.



Here's a link if you would like a tutorial.

<http://www.psqquilt.com/2010/01/siggy-block-tutorial.html> (Note: The measurements in this tutorial are different than given here. Please use 3½" and 4½" squares as given above.)

Be sure to sign your block in the white fabric.

- You may want to iron a strip of freezer paper on the back—that will stabilize the fabric and make it easier to sign.
- Keep your signature at least ½" away from the raw edges so that it's not lost in the seam allowances.
- Use a permanent ink pen (like Nano-Liner or Micron Pigma) to sign your name. If you'd like to see signature samples in a variety of pens after they've been washed, check this blog post: www.seamstobeyouandme.com/2015/11/01/the-great-signature-pen-debate-the-final-decision

Make as many as you want, but be sure to start with a 4" white square and (2) 3" squares—use any color but keep the corners the same color in each block.
